She has studied with noted artists Richard Schmid, Al Brouillette, Joyce Pike, Robert E. Wood and Ovanes Berberian. In addition, she is a skilled teacher and conducts workshops for aspiring painters. She markets her work primarily through her web sites, and higher-end galleries. Elin is the author of one of the newest books from Walter Foster, *Horses in Acrylics*, as well as three instructional videos. Other paintings have been featured in the *Artists Magazine*, *Art Talk*, and *Horses in Art* magazines.

Elin's home and studio are located in the mountainous terrain north of the Temecula wine country of Southern California. She lives with her husband and a variety of domestic animals (horses, goats, dogs, cats, chickens) all of which have found their way into her paintings.
